

SCIENTIFIC SESSIONS

All scientific sessions (except posters) offer CME credit. Courses are in-depth half or full day sessions that require an additional fee. You must register for the meeting first to be able to purchase course tickets. You can enroll in courses when you register for the meeting. Courses can be added after registering for the meeting by visiting the attendee service center.

To be admitted into your course, you must present your course ticket. To attend a session that is not a course, use the *Guide to the 2018 Annual Meeting* distributed on site to find the session room. You should arrive at least 20 minutes before the session since seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. No separate registration is required, but your registration badge is required for entry and will be checked at the door.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Participants will be given the opportunity to evaluate and provide feedback of their learning experience, enter the total credits they are claiming and obtain a CME certificate. To document credits, attendees should maintain a list of sessions they attend on the CME Daily Attendance Log located in the *Guide to the 2018 Annual Meeting* or via APA's Meetings App. Credit is earned on an hour-for-hour basis. All scientific sessions are designated for AMA PRA Category 1 Credits, except for poster sessions.

To obtain CME Certificate for physicians or a Certificate of Attendance for non-physicians stop by the CME Certificate Booth located at the Javits Center, Special Events Hall Foyer, Level 1, or access the evaluation online at <http://www.psychiatry.org/AnnualMeetingCME> during or after the meeting until August 2018.

CME credit for APA members completing the evaluation will be recorded at education.psychiatry.org and transferred to the ABPN Physician Folio in August. The American Psychiatric Association (APA) is accredited by the ACCME to provide continuing medical education for physicians. APA designates this live activity for a maximum of 40 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

The *Guide to the 2018 Annual Meeting* will list these activities, as well as how these are recorded per the Physician Payment Sunshine Act.
