- Fees** —(1) There is no registration fee for members of the Association or for official program participants and their immediate families.

SUGGESTING TO PARTICIPANTS IN THE SCIENTIFIC MEETINGS

Your *Committee on Program* has attempted to design a format that would reflect your interests and needs as you have communicated them. The responsibility is upon the participants to insure its orderly and prompt running. It is hoped that discussion and questions will be encouraged and that free and easy communication will be established in each session.

Chairmen of Sessions should please:

1. Before attending meeting, study abstracts and obtain biographical information concerning authors for appropriate introductions.
2. Call all meetings to order on schedule.
3. Welcome, but limit appropriately, relevant comments from the floor and rebuttal from the podium after the formal discussion of each presentation.
4. Share duties with co-chairmen unless in the absence of secretaries they are performing those duties.

Secretaries will find an envelope containing a gavel and reporting form on the desk of the meeting room and will confer with chairmen and co-chairmen in filling out formal reports of the sessions (to be signed jointly), and assist them in conducting the meeting. They are also responsible for seeing that the number of the paper being read is posted prominently at the front of the hall. When the program is over, please place the executed reporting form in the envelope and turn it in to the office of the *American Journal of Psychiatry*, Room 423, Sheraton-Waikiki Hotel, between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Secretaries will please include the gavel with the reporting form on delivery to the Journal office.

Secretaries may be requested to supply the Program Committee with special information which they will please turn in directly to the *Program Committee Office*.

Officers at all meetings will, hopefully, comment personally and encourage others to do so at appropriate times.

Speakers will please confine themselves to the time allotted for their presentations. Your chairmen will signal when two minutes remain. In general, a presentation scheduled for 20 minutes should be no longer than eight to 10 double-spaced typewritten pages, and less if there are tables and figures to be shown. Time yourself at home and cut out sections, if indicated. If you wish to provide an amended manuscript to the *American Journal of Psychiatry*, please send two copies (marked "amended") to Dr. Francis J. Braceland, *Editor*. Authors of numbered papers are reminded that all such papers are the property of the *Journal*, although because of space limitations fewer than half of the annual meeting papers can be published in the *Journal*. Permission must be secured from the *Editor* before a paper may be published elsewhere.

Formal Discussants, in almost every case, were supplied with copies of presentations for their study in advance of the meeting. If this has not been possible in your case, please secure a copy directly from the author at your first opportunity on arrival in Honolulu. You may, if you wish, submit your discussion in the form of a double-spaced typescript of not more than 700 words to The Editor, *American Journal of Psychiatry*, for possible publication.

Floor discussion, where indicated, is welcomed and all members and guests are invited to join in free discussion of any paper as indicated by the chairman.

SENSITIZATION FOR CRISIS INTERVENTION**

Students are demanding "relevant" training which prepares them to "do something." This is evident in teaching programs that take on commitments to sensitize students to working with patients in crisis. Utilizing the suicidal crisis as the prototype of mental health emergencies, we illustrate psychodramatic techniques for instructors and students.
