



Dear APA Members and Guests,

Welcome to the American Psychiatric Association's IPS: The Mental Health Services Conference in Washington, D.C. This year's theme is *Implementing Prevention Across Psychiatric Practice*.

In the last 20 years, medicine has increasingly moved toward a focus on prevention. The idea is to identify those at risk through the use of genetic and other molecular markers and begin treatment before their symptoms emerge. Collaborative Care, Prevention, Psychopharmacology, and Technology. A complete list of sessions for all of these tracks is available in this *Guide* and searchable on the APA Meetings app as well.

There is a diverse offering of CME opportunities available at the conference, designed so that attendees are able to master new material in depth. I'm particularly excited about workshops on implementing primary care in community mental health centers and integrating psychiatric and primary care with social services across institutions. Our goal for this conference is for attendees to participate in these courses, workshops and symposia and come away enriched and ready to transform the systems of care in which they work.

As always, we are grateful for tremendous support of this conference from the American Association of Community Psychiatrists (AACCP). The AACCP will host a reception for all meeting attendees on Friday evening.




Floor Plans

Washington Hilton & Towers


LOBBY LEVEL

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


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Program Format Descriptions

Courses

Courses are designed to emphasize learning experiences that actively involve participants and include the opportunity for informal exchange with faculty. Offered in four-hour (half-day), six-hour (full-day) and eight-hour (full-day) sessions, courses either review basic concepts in a special subject area or present advanced material on a circumscribed topic. Participants must purchase tickets to attend.

Forums

Forums are flexible 90-minute presentations that afford an opportunity to highlight and select timely topics of interest to psychiatrists. Speakers and panel members are chosen for their expertise and leadership in the field.

Learning Lab

The Learning Lab introduces an exciting new way to learn at the IPS Conference. Each session in the Learning Lab transforms learning through collaboration, rich discussion around issues impacting psychiatry and hands-on learning. Sessions include a mock trial, a collaborative care simulation game, a shark tank-style psychiatric innovation lab and a medical directors' boot camp.

Lectures

Lectures feature a small number of distinguished speakers discussing scientific and cultural topics, many of which will extend our understanding beyond the usual limits of clinical psychiatry. The Scientific Program Committee invites the lecturers to present as part of the scientific program.

Posters

This format highlights presentations of very recent findings. Posters are visual, self-explanatory presentations. See the Poster Sessions section (page 52) of this book for a complete schedule of poster presentations.

Rapid-Fire Talks


These 90-minute sessions contain two to three separate oral presentations grouped by topic, with audience discussion following each presentation. Attendees are encouraged to participate in each presentation during a session, even if they come to see one talk in particular.

Symposia

Symposia are three-hour sessions consisting of four to six presentations that are thematically linked and focus on a specific topic relevant to clinical psychiatry. They are designed to provide comprehensive treatment of a topic or discussion of the topic from several points of view and stimulate discussion with the audience.

Workshops

Workshops are 90-minute sessions that typically involve brief presentations from individual panel members, followed by the opportunity for lively and informative discussion. This format provides for substantial audience participation and is highly interactive.





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
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
