### **Becoming an Allied Organization Recognized by the Assembly**

Professional organizations of psychiatrists with subspecialty skills and interest that have been in existence for 5 years, have at least one meeting of its membership annually, and whose mission and code of ethics are not in conflict with those of the American Psychiatric Association, may apply for designation as Assembly Allied Organizations. If the

organization is international, its US branch may apply for designation as an Allied Organization. Such organizations, not to exceed 25 at any one time, may be designated Allied Organizations if they meet the requirements below.

- a. The organization has a minimum of 100 APA member psychiatrists OR if the organization was an Assembly Allied Organization as of January 1, 2015, it has more than 60 but fewer than 100 member psychiatrists (grandfathered allied organizations).
- b. Psychiatrists comprise a majority of voting members of the organization.
- c. At least 40% of the total number of psychiatrist members are members of the America Psychiatric Association.
