

Distinguished Service Award





Chester M. Pierce Human Rights Award

The APA Chester M. Pierce Human Rights Award recognizes the extraordinary efforts of individuals and organizations to promote the human rights of populations with mental health needs by bringing attention to their work. Originally established in 1990 to raise awareness of human rights abuses, the award was renamed in 2017 to honor Chester M. Pierce, M.D. (1927-2016) and recognize his dedication as an innovative researcher on humans in extreme environments, an advocate against disparities, stigma, and discrimination, and as a pioneer and visionary in global mental health. In 2021, the award was endowed by the APA Foundation's Chester M. Pierce Human Rights Endowment Campaign.

Grégoire Ahongbonon is the founder of Association Saint-Camille-de-Lellis (ASC) which helps people in West Africa suffering from mental illness. ASC is composed of clinics and centers offering affordable and adapted neuropsychiatric inpatient, outpatient, and rehabilitation care in Ivory Coast, Benin, and Togo. These centers form a comprehensive mental health care system, approved by the World Health Organization (WHO), supporting 130,000 patients. Grégoire is the recipient of the WHO Geneva Prize for Human Rights, the Aurora Humanitarian Initiative “Awakening Humanity” Prize, and the Dr. Guislain “Breaking the Chains of Stigma” Award recognizing his contributions to reduce stigma associated with mental illness. ■

Established in 2014 to honor David A. Mrazek, M.D., FRCPsych, and to recognize his contributions as a pioneer in the field of pharmacogenomics. Selected by the Mrazek Award Committee, this award is given to an individual for recent work in psychiatric pharmacogenomics and his/her ability to translate research findings to a clinical audience.

He received his medical degree and doctorate degrees in neurology from the University of North Carolina School of Medicine. ■

She graduated from the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center and completed her residency at Wright State University. 

John Fryer Award

The John Fryer Award, established in 2005, honors an individual who has contributed to improving the mental health of sexual minorities. The award is named for Dr. John Fryer, a gay psychiatrist who played a crucial role in prompting APA to review the scientific data and to remove homosexuality from its diagnostic list of mental disorders in 1973.

Kenneth Ashley, M.D., is Assoc Prof of Psychiatry, Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and Consultation-Liaison Psychiatrist, Mount Sinai Beth Israel (MSBI). He is Director of Outpt C-L Psychiatry at MSBI and psychiatric liaison, Mount Sinai Center for Transgender Medicine and Surgery Post-Surgical Gender Affirmation Surgery Service. He is former President of AGLP, and addresses issues on diversity/equity/inclusion (DEI) and Social Justice with NYSPA, GAP, and Mount Sinai. He writes and speaks on mental health issues at the intersection of HIV, DEI, and social justice. ■

Robert Rohrbaugh, M.D. graduated from Franklin and Marshall College and completed medical school, residency, and geriatric psychiatry fellowship at Yale. A member of the Yale faculty since 1988, Bob is professor of psychiatry and has served as both the clerkship director and residency program director. Bob has been committed to teaching trainees to listen to a patient's narrative, identify pertinent data, organize that data within a bio-psycho-social framework, and use the resulting formulation to both drive treatment planning and sustain the trainee's empathic connection with their patient. This data-driven formulation approach is outlined in *The Biopsychosocial Formulation Manual*, a co-authored monograph. ■

Established in 1987 to recognize significant contributions toward understanding the impact and import of Asian cultural heritage in areas relevant to psychiatry. The award also seeks to encourage scholarship and research in culture-specific mental health issues and treatment needs of Asian populations and to stimulate scientific exchange on transcultural issues. This award is funded by a grant from the late Kun-Po Soo, M.D., Ph.D.

She is the recipient of numerous awards, including the National Book Award, the National Book Critics Circle Award, the presidentially conferred National Humanities Medal, the Medal for Distinguished Contribution to American Letters from the National Book Foundation, and the F. Manfred S. Guttmacher Award


Established in 1975 to honor outstanding contributions to the literature of forensic psychiatry, in the form of a book, monograph, paper or other work presented at any professional meeting or published in the previous year. This award is co-sponsored by the American Academy of Psychiatry and the Law.

Jens Hoffmann, Ph.D., is a psychologist and head of the Institute of Psychology and Threat Management, based in Germany. He has published more than 70 scientific papers and also assisted the German Bundestag in rendering the act of stalking a criminal offense. Dr. Hoffmann also was a main consultant in developing regional threat management programs in Europe. He is a former President of the Association of European Threat Assessment Professionals (AETAP) and a founding associate editor of the *Journal of Threat Assessment and Management*. With his team he also developed a family of online risk assessment tools known as DYRIAS. ■



Nasrallah Family Award for Advances in Psychiatric Neuroscience

Established in 2020 and endowed by the Nasrallah family, this award recognizes distinguished contributions to Psychiatric Neuroscience that have had a major impact on the field and/or altered the practice of psychiatry.

Joseph T. Coyle, M.D. graduated from the Johns Hopkins Medical School in 1969 and completed his Pediatric Internship, Psychiatric Residency at Hopkins and a research fellowship with Nobel Prize Laureate, Julius Axelrod, PhD at NIMH. He was elected to the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) in 1990, to President of the Society for Neuroscience (1991) and received the NAM Sarnat Award in 2017 “for the advancement of mental health”. His research has addressed the neurobiology of Huntington Disease, Alzheimer Disease, and Down Syndrome. Recently, he has marshalled evidence that the glutamatergic synapse is a major site of pathology in schizophrenia. ■

Established in 1983 in memory of Oskar Pfister, an ordained minister who studied and used psychoanalytic principles in his work, to honor outstanding contributions in the fields of psychiatry and religion. This award is supported by the Association of Professional Chaplains and the Harding Foundation.

Tanya Marie Luhmann, Ph.D. is the Albert Ray Lang Professor at Stanford University, in the Stanford Anthropology Department (and Psychology, by courtesy) Her work focuses on the anthropology of mind, and the way different representations of mind affect spiritual and psychiatric experience—in particular, the voices of spirit and the voices of madness. She was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 2003 and received a John Guggenheim Fellowship award in 2007. She is the author of *Of Two Minds*, *Our Most Troubling Madness*, *How God Becomes Real* and other books. ■



She receives the 2022 Jacob Javits Award for her leadership in creating a framework for the state's 988 system, improving mental health advance directives, and establishing the Office for Behavioral Health Ombuds. ■

This award is co-sponsored by the American Association of Chairs of Departments of Psychiatry.

Robert Sweet, M.D. is UPMC Endowed Professor of Psychiatric Neuroscience and Professor of Neurology at the University of Pittsburgh. He is Director of the Clinical Core of the University of Pittsburgh Alzheimer Disease Research Center, and directs an NIMH-funded postdoctoral training program emphasizing Translational Neuroscience Research. Dr. Sweet's honors include the NARSAD Distinguished Investigator Grant from the Brain & Behavior Research Foundation; American Association for Geriatric Psychiatry's Distinguished Scientist Award, and; The Geriatric Research Award from the American College of Psychiatrists. Dr. Sweet's lab investigates the mechanisms leading to the joint liability to cognitive and psychotic symptoms in Alzheimer disease and schizophrenia, using a variety of approaches including genomic, human brain tissue, genetic animal model, and in vitro studies. ■
